

T32 Nights of Camping Recognition

The PLC voted on May 12, 2009 to implement a “Nights of Camping” recognition system in the troop.

The 100 nights of camping award sheet will be posted to the troop website. Scouts will be required to record their nights of camping on this sheet. When they reach 10 nights of camping they will have it verified with the troop record system and the camping recognition coordinator will initial off. They will then receive a color cord to wear on their shoulder loop indicating the nights of camping they have completed. Each time the scout earns an additional 10 nights of camping then they will go through the verification process and receive another color cord to add to his should loop. It is the scouts responsibility to present the correct form to the coordinator and have it verified. The scout is responsible for keeping up with their form until it gets turned in for the 100 nights of camping award. It is then recommended that the scout begins a new form to track nights of camping.

This is temporary recognition, like the temporary patch you can wear on your right uniform pocket.

The cords will be given out in the following order:

- 10 nights – Red cord
- 20 nights – Sunshine (Yellow) cord
- 30 nights – Royal cord
- 40 nights – Kelly Green cord
- 50 nights – Sky Blue cord
- 60 nights – Orange cord
- 70 nights – Purple cord
- 80 nights – Cactus Green cord
- 90 nights – Stone cord
- 100 nights – Cinnamon Cord
- 110 nights – Lavender Cord
- 120 nights – Meadow Green Cord
- 130 nights – Ocean Blue Cord
- 140 nights – Dijon Yellow Cord
- 150 nights – Tan Cord
